The Visit from the Designer

There was such a buzz of friendship and bonhomie at Annesley on Wednesday 2 December when ninety people enjoyed the dinner to meet Kate Cullity. Kate's illustrated talk brought to life her ambitious plans for the development of the gardens. A director of Taylor Cullity Lethlean (TCL), the firm hired by SHBG Ltd to design the gardens, Kate gave context to the vision that many in the audience had only seen previously in the form of concept or sketch plans.

She noted that her firm's plan for the SHBG is not only a thematic journey through the landscape of the Southern Highlands, but also an opportunity to celebrate the district's natural, horticultural and gardening heritage. Kate believes the result will be a standout garden with an architecturally significant visitors' centre that will become a landmark in itself.

SHBG chairman Charlotte Webb said that the vision was now one step closer to reality. "Guests were able to see and hear for themselves how TCL's interpretation of our plans will result in a truly world-class botanic garden right here in the Southern Highlands," she said. "It is now up to us and our supporters to make it happen."

We were delighted that John Siemon (Curator Manager of the Australian Botanic Garden, Mount Annan) and his wife, Fran, and also Greg Bourne (Curator Manager at the Blue Mountains Botanic Garden, Mount Tomah) were able to attend the dinner. They were both very pleased to meet Kate Cullity and the SHBG Board.

As most of you will be aware, TCL is an internationally acclaimed firm of landscape architects and urban designers and the winner in two consecutive years of the World Architecture Festival – Landscape of the Year Award, 2013 for the Australian Garden at Cranbourne (Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne) and 2014 the National Arboretum in Canberra. This year they won, among many other awards, the AILA SA Medal for Landscape Architecture for its design of the Adelaide Botanic Gardens Wetlands.

The Friends Committee expresses its thanks to the donors of the raffle prizes, which were won by Grant Blanchard, Tony and Ann Emmett, and Margaret Roberts. The dinner and raffle raised over \$2,500, which will be put towards the cost of new pathways.

Personalised Pavers

There has been considerable interest from Friends about the opportunity to buy more personalised pavers. The opportunity has arisen with the new pathways planned for the next stage of the development. There will probably be enough space for about 125 inscribed pavers in the 'headers' of the pathways—that is, the edging bricks which surround the centre patterned section.



The paths and ramps will be a T-shaped pattern leading from the shade house area onto the veranda of the shed and to the toilets. The ramps will allow

wheelchair access. Every second brick may be inscribed in the pathways, which will be built with grant money (\$5,000) and additional monies raised by the Friends. The final design of the paths has not yet been decided but it is likely to be a basket weave as in the photo.
