# Council support delayed

Although Wingecarribee Shire Council Mayor Gordon Lewis has thrown his support behind the proposed Botanic Gardens, delays will now be incurred.

In October Cr Lewis agreed to open debate with Council that a commitment be made to grant a lease for Bong Bong Common and Suttor Rd Reserve at a nominal rent.

However at a recent meeting

between the SHBG, the Mayor and General Manager Mike Hyde, the General Manager asked to delay the Council debate until after the completion of the Conservation Management Plan and Plan of Management.

The consultant preparing these plans is not expected to be appointed until late December at the earliest, with plans expected to be finalised by September 2007.



You may be wondering why our newsletter is named Operculum.

An operculum is the little cap in a Eucalypt flower bud which is formed from the fused petals and sepals. When the cap comes off the

(pronounced Opěr'cũl | um)

'flower' appears with the unfurling of the stamen.
