In September 2008 the Wingecarribee Shire Council agreed to support the Southern Highlands Botanic Garden (SHBG) in our approach to the NSW Government to look at Hillview, Sutton Forest. as a potential site for the Botanic Gardens.

"Hillview" was purchased by the NSW Government and used as country retreat by 17 Governors from 1882 to 1957 when

it passed into private ownership. It was gifted to the people of NSW in 1985 by Mr Edwin Klein.

The 60 hectares (150 acres) site lav idle for nearly 15 years until it was advertised for lease.

After 10 years of renovation, the current tenant is anticipating opening the property as a boutique hotel.

The Committee made an approach to the Minister for Planning. Ms Kristina Keneally, to consider establishing a botanic garden ion the site.

Unfortunately, the Minister advised the Department is currently in discussions with the existing tenant regarding the future tenure of the property and is unable to discuss the matter further with the SHBG.
