About the SH Botanic Gardens

Southern Highlands Botanic Gardens is unique for a number of reasons:

- It is one of the newest botanic gardens in Australia, established in 2010, on a 15-hectare council owned site in Bowral.
- The garden is wholly community funded and operated, unlike most other Australian botanic gardens.
- The design of the garden reflects all seasons in a cool climate, with something to see all year, showcasing flora not often seen by the public elsewhere in Australia.
- The garden design encompasses a town garden, represented by exotic plantings; a country garden, with a mix of exotic and native plantings; and a regional garden, characterized by native plantings.
- Our four national registered collections of box (Buxus), birch (Betula), dwarf dogwoods and Tony Davis daffodils, all help ensure the conservation of significant plants. Importantly, they



are all suitable for the home garden in a cool climate like the Southern Highlands.

Although we are a new botanic garden, we have aspirations to be an important tourist drawcard in the Southern Highlands. The garden will make a vital contribution to the public parks in the region. It will complement, in a significant way, the private gardens in the district that are rarely open to the public. In due course, the garden will make a major contribution to the economic and social wellbeing of the Wingecarribee Shire.

By the Community, for the Community

Working bees at the garden are held every Tuesday morning. Around 30-50 community volunteers regularly attend and perform tasks to suit their abilities. The work can be general garden maintenance to suit the season, propagation and growing of plants in the nursery. The plants we grow are either planted out in the garden or sold to the public. Some people also get involved in our children's education program.

We welcome everyone to the garden, which is open every day of the year from 9am to 5pm, free entry.

Our plant nursery sells plants that are growing in the garden and is open to the public on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9am.

Our events during the year are designed to engage with the broader community - people of all ages, cultures and abilities.

In April, our Autumn Garden weekend and Plant Fair, usually features the opening of five beautiful private local gardens and a plant fair with rare and unusual plants for sale. This annual event attracts garden enthusiasts from near and far. In 2024 a single exceptional local property, but with four different garden spaces on show, has been the attraction.

In May, open day guided tours and a plant sale. Bring a picnic; enjoy the gardens!

In August we have our kite flying day. There's a workshop for kids to make their own kite while Mum and Dad enjoy food and drink and walk around.

In October our Rare and Collectables Plant Stall is always a popular event for all gardening enthusiasts during Spring.

In December, our annual sale of seasonal hydrangeas including many heritage varieties, plus lots of other special plants and succulents to fill your Christmas stockings.



Bibury

The garden at Bibury surrounds a heritage listed house designed by the renowned architect Prof. Leslie Wilkinson, in his influential Mediterranean style. The house was constructed in 1929 and parts of the garden are from this time although numerous owners have contributed to the current garden fabric. The garden features a central courtyard, recently replanted to complement the architecture, an enormous wisteria clad pergola, Buxus maze, rose gardens, towering hedges and many fine old trees. The recent renovation of the house and garden in 2018 will ensure the property will endure for many years to come.





Kunama

68 Osborne Road, Burradoo | Owner: Ellie Scott










This charming large town garden of around two acres, has been developed by the current owner over the last twenty years. Large established trees provide the bones of the garden with many large sweeping garden beds brimming with perennials, roses and an array of interesting shrubs link the established plantings. Hydrangeas, particularly Pandiculata's feature widely as do masse of Hellebores.

An intimate sheltered courtyard provides a quite place to take in the long view into the garden. More recently a meadow garden with ornamental grasses and large perennials enveloping a wisteria covered pergola has been installed.


Take the Shuttlebus from the Southern Highlands Botanic Gardens Car Park for a 5-minute ride to the garden. There's no parking available at the garden.








A manicured garden of around 5 acres surrounding a house built in the 1990's adjacent to the Wingecarribee River. The treelined driveway terminates in a large turning circle beside a large pond with it's own flock of ducks. The extensive garden features many elegant sitting areas and terraces overlooking the river. Perennial and shrub filled garden beds sweep beneath the structure of century old trees, remnants of a bygone garden. Vast Oaks, Gleditsia and Elms provide the sense of age in a relatively modern garden while many sculptures and garden ornaments provide a contemporary flavour.









